CHILDREN'S SERMON

WORD

FIRST READING: Zephaniah 1:7-18 PB 765

⁷Be silent before the Lord GOD, for the day of the LORD is at hand! The LORD has prepared a sacrifice; he has consecrated his guests. ⁸ And on the day of the LORD's sacrifice I will punish the officials and the king's sons and all who dress themselves in foreign attire. ⁹On that day I will punish all who leap over the threshold, who fill their master's house with violence and fraud. ¹⁰On that day, says the LORD, a cry will be heard from the Fish Gate, a wail from the Second Quarter, a loud crash from the hills.¹¹ The inhabitants of the Mortar wail, for all the traders have perished; all who weigh out silver are cut off. ¹² At that time I will search Jerusalem with lamps, and I will punish the people who settle like dregs in wine, those who say in their hearts, "The LORD will not do good, nor will he do harm." ¹³ Their wealth shall be plundered and their houses laid waste. Though they build houses, they shall not inhabit them; though they plant vineyards, they shall not drink wine from them. ¹⁴ The great day of the LORD is near, near and hastening fast; the sound of the day of the LORD is bitter; the warrior cries aloud there. ¹⁵ That day will be a day of wrath, a day of distress and anguish, a day of ruin and devastation, a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness, ¹⁶ a day of trumpet blast and battle cry against the fortified cities and against the lofty battlements. ¹⁷ I will bring such distress upon people that they shall walk like the blind; because they have sinned against

the LORD, their blood shall be poured out like dust and their flesh like dung. ¹⁸ Neither their silver nor their gold will be able to save them on the day of the LORD's wrath; in the fire of his passion the whole earth shall be consumed, for a full, a terrible end he will make of all the inhabitants of the earth. *WORD OF GOD, WORD OF LIFE.* **THANKS BE TO GOD. PSALM:** *Psalm 90:1-12* PB 476-477 (*read responsively*)

¹ Lord, you have been our dwelling place^[a] in all generations. ² Before the mountains were brought forth or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God. ³ You turn us^[b] back to dust and say, "Turn back, you mortals." ⁴ For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past or like a watch in the night. ⁵ You sweep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; ⁶ in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers. ⁷ For we are consumed by your anger; by your wrath we are overwhelmed. ⁸ You have set our iniquities before you, our secret sins in the light of your countenance. ⁹ For all our days pass away under your wrath; our years come to an end^[c] like a sigh. ¹⁰ The days of our life are seventy years or perhaps eighty, if we are strong; even then their span^[d] is only toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away. ¹¹ Who considers the power of your anger? Your wrath is as great as the fear that is due you. ¹² So teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart.

SECOND READING: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 PB 960-961 (read responsively)

¹Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. ² For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. ³ When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! ⁴ But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; ⁵ for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. ⁶ So, then, let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober, ⁷ for those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. ⁸ But since we belong to the day, let us be sober and put on the breastplate of faith and love and for a helmet the hope of salvation. ⁹ For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁰ who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. ¹¹ Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing. *WORD OF GOD, WORD OF LIFE. THANKS BE TO GOD*.
